MECUM JUST CONCLUDED ITS AUCTION IN DALLAS, TEXAS,

which included a nice Cadillac collection from Bill's Backyard Classics. Bill's is a family-friendly museum based out of Amarillo, Texas, and the no-reserve sale featured a variety of Cadillacs from the 1940s to the mid-1970s. Twenty-five Cadillacs found new homes, selling for a combined \$254,100. Among those available was this 1949 Coupe de Ville that featured a 338cu.in. OHV V-8, automatic transmission, fender skirts, drum brakes, and AM/FM radio. The final bid hammered home at \$17,600. THIS TURNPIKE CRUISER CAME WITH ALL power items in 1957. Its interesting styling included air ducts on top of the windshield, overhanging roof with retractable rear window, and gold inserts that ran the length of the sculpted rear fenders.

The four-door hardtop sedan was the most common body style that year, with 8,305 produced.

This particular Mercury had been a part of the Shrine of the Holy Grille, known for its large collection of

Edsels among other FoMoCo cars. The subject of an older restoration, this Turnpike Cruiser still had a brilliant twotone scheme in Sunset Orchid over Classic White. This was allegedly one of fewer than 50 with factory air conditioning and had memory seats along with all of the standard power features. When the bidding ended, this fine example of mid-50s styling sold at a fair price for both buyer and seller, considering that quality four-doors from the 1950s are becoming more desirable.
