In 1621 Thanksgiving was a three day celebration of geese, chucks and deer primarily. Pumpkin pie was not part of the 1621 celebration, but it is today. The first Thanksgiving took place between 53 colonists and 90 Wampanoag Indians. Today 80% of Americans will celebrate the holiday with 12 relatives on average.

We started out heading to the west coast and spent the first night at the General Patton museum at Chiriaco Summit off of I-10. We've driven by this place 100 times, but finally checked it out. Very interesting.

The goal of the trip was to drive short distances with the motor-home and then spend a few days to really see the area. The first major stop was the Santa Barbara/Solvang area in southern CA. One exciting find there was the Mendenhall Museum of Gas Pumps and Petroliana. This a great stop for all you classic car enthusiasts – the most extensive collection of old gas pumps and signs I've ever seen. The owner was most gracious to let Towanda tour the grounds and have her picture taken.

Many of our stops were at Harvest Host locations. These are wineries, breweries, distilleries, farms and museums that allow free overnight RV parking and only ask that you visit their facility and buy some product (how could you not when you're at a winery or distillery)! The 1957 MK2 FERRET

For those of you who are fans of 50"s vehicle, here's one you might find interesting, A 1957 MK2 Ferret Scout car. Ferret weighs in at 8000 pounds of British armored fighting and reconnaissance four-wheel-drive vehicle. The Ferret was built by Daimler from 1952 through 1971, a total of 4,409 were built. MK2 Ferret is powered by a straight 6, overhead valve, Rolls Royce B60, 120 hp engine which used regular gas. Five speed transmission top speed 58 mph in forward or reverse using 4-9 mpgVehicle is capable of driving in30" deep water, with a still water speed of 2.4 mph, and a bilge pump of 45 gallons/per minute. Ferret could pull an load of 8000 pounds on a trailer.

This vehicle is operated by one driver and one gunner, and equipped from the factory with a rotating turret and Browning 30 cal, machine gun for protection. Don't want to get in a road rage battle!

Gregg and Linda"s grandson, Timothy, calls this "Grandpa's tank" and their son, Alan, says he is ready to hit the streets.
