Second, ARTICLE V1: MEETING MEMBERS. Includes All meeting shall be conducted in accordance with "Condensed Roberts Rules and Order of business". **ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER NEWLY REVISED 12TH EDITION** published in September 2020, does not reference a "Condensed" version" but does reference **R.O.B.E.R.T.'S RULES OF ORDER NEWLY REVISED IN BRIEF**, and I updated the meeting reference to the ... **IN BRIEF** publication.

There are also grammatical and syntax changes included in this update.

The attached change tracking document shows previous and revised text for all changes. The Gray vertical line in the left margin indicates a change in text to the right. All changed or new text in the body is red. Text deleted from the body is shown in the right margin at the end of a red line.

Per **ARTICLE VIII: AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS** requires an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the eligible voting members who submit their vote, so I ask everyone to spend some time to review these updates and vote by July 15th.

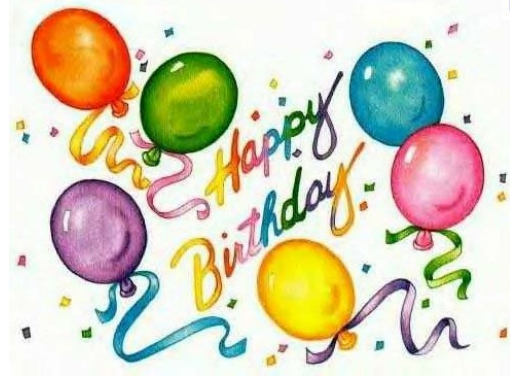

ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of this organization is the Arizona Classic Thunderbird Club Incorporated. **The** club operates as A.C.T.C., Chapter 35 of Classic Thunderbird Club International (C.T.C.I.), incorporated in the State of **Wyoming**.

ARTICLE II: PURPOSE

a) To operate and maintain an organization to encourage and promote the admiration, ownership, care, and maintenance, with **the** safe and courteous operation of the "Classic Thunderbird", defined herein as the two passenger 1955,1956, and 1957 Ford Thunderbird automobile. b) To serve as a medium for exchanging **ing** of ideas, information, and parts for admirers and owners of the Classic Thunderbirds; to aid them in restoring and preserving these automobiles in their original likeness. c) To unite as a local organization those admirers and owners of Classic Thunderbirds who are interested in restoring and maintaining their automobiles in a manner that will promote public admiration and respect. d) To promote an active Chapter organization to meet, socialize, maintain the spirit of good fellowship, and participate in activities including the use of Classic Thunderbirds. e) To further the interests of **Classic Thunderbirds'** owners and drivers of and to promote the safety and enjoyment of motoring. f) To engage in any other activity related to that described above from time to time as authorized or approved by the officers or members of this Chapter.

ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP a) Membership shall be open to persons interested in the **above**-expressed purposes of this Chapter. b) There shall be two classes of membership. Ownership of a classic Thunderbird is strongly encouraged, though not mandatory. The rights, obligations, and privileges of each class of membership shall be as follows:

1. Regular Membership - A regular member and or spouse shall be anyone current in yearly dues. Each member shall be entitled to hold executive office. Each regular member and or spouse and or non-married partner listed in the current membership roll shall be entitled to one vote on all matters submitted to a **membership vote**, to participate in activities, and therefore is considered a member.

2. Honorary Membership - An honorary member and or spouse shall not be required to pay dues. Each shall be entitled to one vote on all matters submitted to a vote of the membership, to participate in activities, and to hold executive office. An honorary member shall be an individual

To be listed in the Roster, dues must reach the Membership Desk by January 20. d) New members joining after February 1 will have their dues prorated.

e) One yearly **Roster** and one monthly newsletter will be provided to only one address on the membership application. Additional rosters and monthly newsletters can be ordered for a fee at the time dues are paid. f) The Executive Board of this Chapter is hereby granted the exclusive power and discretion to reject the application or terminate the membership of any person. This Executive Board as a group and as a result of their unanimous agreement shall take such action.

ARTICLE IV: OFFICERS

a) The Executive Officers of the Arizona Classic Thunderbird Club shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Ways and Means, Board Member at Large, and Ex-Officio Board Member. These officers will also constitute the Executive Board.

b) The duties of the President shall be:

1. To issue the call for regular and special meetings of the Club.

2. To preside over meetings of the Club.

3. To schedule regular elections and **ensure** that they are held in accordance with the By-Laws.

4. To implement, administer, and explain the policies of the Executive Board.

5. To delegate authority and responsibility as necessary to accomplish the purposes of the Club.

6. To form and appoint committees as needed. Every committee shall be accountable to the President.

2. To process all incoming and outgoing correspondence.
3. To perform other duties that may be specifically assigned by the President. e) The duties of Treasurer shall be:

1. To record dues collected by the Membership Chairperson and to collect other income of the Club.
2. To maintain the Club's financial records.
3. To make payment from the Club's funds as authorized by the President and Treasurer, or by the majority of the Board.
4. To make regular reports of the Club's financial status.
5. To file necessary reports to state and other regulatory bodies as needed.

6. To perform other duties that may be specifically assigned by the President. f) The duties of the Ways and Means shall be:

ARTICLE V: ELECTIONS

a) All nominees for any office must be active members or Honorary members in good standing.

b) The Ex-Officio Board Member is not an elected officer and shall be the immediate past President, if available, and have all the privileges of an Executive Board Member.

c) All officers must remain active regular or Honorary members in good standing for the duration of their terms in office.

d) All officers must be a member, or spouse of a member, of C.T.C.I. in good standing for the duration of their terms in office.

e) Any vacancy occurring in any office after the regular election may be filled by a majority vote of the remaining Executive Officers, and shall be consistent with the qualification requirements of these By-Laws.

ARTICLE VI: MEETING OF MEMBERS

a) The time and place of meetings shall be designated by the President.

b) Written notice of meetings shall be given to each member in good standing prior to each meeting. The Club newsletter shall constitute proper written notice unless an alternate method is deemed necessary and so ordered by the President.

c) At regular meetings, the voting members in good standing who remain in attendance shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

d) In the event the President or a quorum of the Executive Board calls a special meeting verbally or with less than 24 hours notice, a quorum shall consist of 20% of the Club's voting memberse) The order of business for meetings of the Cub is as follows:

1. Call to order
2. Introduction of new members and visitors
3. Review and approval of minutes of **the** previous meeting
4. Secretary's report and reading of correspondence
5. Treasurer's report
6. Committee reports
7. Unfinished business
