Meeting adjourned 10:25am



# **Continuation from last month's Vapor Lock Article.**

To collect fuel temperature data, I installed thermocouples at various locations on the fuel and cooling systems. The final four locations were: 1. The fuel line at the tank, 2. The fuel line adjacent to the carburetor, 3. the thermostat housing and 4. the return connection of the water pump. The initial data indicated the need to reduce the heat gained by the fuel as it flows from the gas tank to the carburetor, I looked for insulation to replace the 'loom' on the fuel line from the tank all the way forward to the connection to the flexible hose to the fuel pump, and then from the pump to the carburetor. I selected Insultherm from TECHFLEX, see figure 1.



I ordered a spool of Their FGN.25BK drop-shipped to CASCO to have three fuel lines for '56 models made. Later I ordered a spool of FGN.38BK to proceed with testing the product on my existing lines.

The Z-line from the fuel pump to the filter was not insulated from FORD so for the sake of authenticity, I replaced the Carbon Steel original Z-line with a one bent from Stainless Steel tubing which is a slower conductor.

With these two changes in place, the car has not vapor locked over the course of the last two summers
