FOUNTAIN HILLS THANKSGIVING PARADE

Thousands of spectators turned out early Thanksgiving morning to run the Turkey Trot and to watch the annual Thanksgiving Parade in Fountain Hills. We had 8 Thunderbirds from ACTC driven by Bob Michele, Wade Myers, Yvonne Wagner, Rose Marie Busby, George Randall, Douglas Shearer, Club President Chris Ames, and Vice President Gregg Thurston. We also had 9 vehicles from the Arizona Military Vehicle Collectors Club. Each of our drivers could tell you stories about the interesting information they learned from the various veterans who rode in their vehicles.



As an example, in Alan Thurston's 1942 jeep which was the lead vehicle in the parade, rather than carry the usual VFW Commander, this year he carried 98 year old Howard Asher, WWII, [J.S. Navy. Howard advised that during the invasion of iwo Jima, he was assigned to the IJSS Artemis, an attack cargo ship which was anchored on February 19,1945, in transport area "Baker" off the SE, coast of Iwo Jima during the invasion. The Artemis sent boats to assist in transport during the initial attack, remained in the area for 8 days discharging troops and cargo, and took casualties on board. Howard reports that he personally observed the raising of the American Flag on the top of Mount Suribachi on February 23, 1945. This is just one example of the many real life stories which these veterans can recall from their various services in foreign wars on behalf of all of us.

We were cheered and applauded by thousands of spectators as we drove slowly down the parade route. Men, women, and children of all ages wished us "Happy Thanksgiving" and "Thank you for your service". As we drove down the Avenue of the Fountains we could see the fountain spraying water high above the lake. Dogs waged their tails at us and one guy also waved and shouted "Beautiful Corvette". His girlfriend or wife waved at us and appeared to be proud of his knowledge of collector cars. The sky was clear and we were blessed. With a great Arizona November morning for a parade. Meanwhile some poor folks in New York had to dig out from 5' of snow. There was a lot to be thankful for. A big thanks goes to all the drivers who drove their cars or military vehicles making our morning a truly memorable event. And to all of you reading this article, now that Thanksgiving is in the rear view mirror, it is time to say "Merry Christmas to a11." And next month you will see numerous photos from our annual Christmas Party. Raise a glass and celebrate for it is now that time of year!


