Buying a 1955-57 Ford Thunderbird? Here's what you need to know

Sometimes the best ideas don't come from inside a company but rather spring forth as a reaction to external forces. When Chevrolet brought its two-seat Corvette to the New York Auto Show in 1953, it couldn't have known that it was about to inspire Ford to punch back with one of the most storied nameplates in the Blue Oval's history: the Thunderbird.

Although developed in response to the 'Vette, the T-Bird would travel down a winding path, as the vehicle would over the course of its lifetime be made available as a coupe, a roadster, and a sedan. The Thunderbird would also avoid the Corvette's sports car image in favor of "personal luxury," a term that would hold meaning in the industry until the segment was unceremoniously eviscerated by SUVs in the mid-'90s.

The first decade of Thunderbird production would see dramatic shifts in styling, power, and market position. The very first generation of Ford Thunderbird was built exclusively as a two-seat convertible, and only offered between for a short spell from 1955 to 1957. As with many '50s domestics, future valuation prospects for the first-gen Thunderbird don't look exceptional at the moment, and certain variants remain very approachable for collectors.

A gold-standard, #1-condition (Concours-quality) 255 trades for \$65,900, while a driver-quality car is less than half that. For 1957, a rare supercharged edition V-8 soars to nearly a quarter million dollars, with base #3-condition (Good) cars checking in at just under \$40,000 (similar in pricing to 1956 models).

Once your collector car club has been, organized, you want to make it go and grow. Good communications, timely publicity and signing up new members are key elements that keep a club active and strong. The Newsletter Committee will be relied on to keep the membership well informed. Publicity may be the job of appointees like the Club Editor, Club Photographer or Car Show Chairperson or a separate Publicity Secretary can be picked. Membership-building efforts are often the responsibility of the Club Secretary, although larger clubs may want to have a Membership Secretary to work solely in this area.


Club Communication Internal:

To make your collector car club going, members must be informed about what the club is doing and when club events are scheduled. The best way to do this is in a published club newsletter. This can be quarterly, monthly, wherever your club's budget allows. It must also be professional and correct. A portion of the annual dues collected should be set aside for printing and distribution of the newsletter.

Club newsletters don't have to be fancy to be effective. It's the content that's most important. Essential items found in many club newsletters are a calendar of events, club-related or general collector car news, the club's last meeting highlights, announcements/notices, a column written by the club president, opinions, tech tips, a future meeting schedule, special offers to club members, a Member of the Month feature, classified adds listing collector cars and parts for sale by members.

Home computers have made it easier for careful novice to crate a professional-looking newsletter. Widespread use of home computer has also changed the type of publishing media that can be used. In the past, a newsletter had to be printed and mailed each month, which meantwriting checks to a printeror copy shop and the post office. Som car clubs now send their newsletters by e-mail or making it avaible on a website.

Creating a website is another form of communications you'll want to consider today. Internet users are constantly surfing the web for things that fit their interest. It would certainly help your memberhip efforts of your club's website pops up when the words "Collector Car Club".
